Dear Reader,

Thank you for your interest in the *Journal of Liberty and Society*, the new academic journal published by [Students For Liberty](http://www.studentsforliberty.org). The purpose of this journal is to encourage academic inquiry surrounding the topic of liberty and its role in society for undergraduates everywhere. While most journals restrict their subject matter to particular academic disciplines, this journal seeks to break free of the boundaries imposed by disciplines by accepting papers from any academic discipline as well as encouraging interdisciplinary works. The only constraint on paper submissions is that the subject must relate to liberty. Sample papers that may be accepted by the journal might be an historical analysis of Locke's argument for a right to property, an economic study of the adverse consequences of taxation, a philosophical analysis of the problems raised by Marx, or a political science piece on the need for liberal values in establishing the rule of law. This journal is the first of its kind, providing a comprehensive process to review and highlight the academic foundations of liberty.

The *Journal of Liberty and Society* is a peer-reviewed journal. All individuals who act as editors and reviewers are either students or recent graduates that have spent a significant amount of time studying the field for which the paper has been written. Through an in-depth, blind-review process, the best papers related to liberty will not only be selected, but thoroughly critiqued and revised prior to their publication.
